Pastoral Letter

Dear All,

The first 3 months of 2020 have not heralded in a new decade in quite the way we would have hoped. The world has witnessed the devastation of bush fires, earthquakes, infestation of locusts, and nearer home the misery caused by excessive storms and flooding. All of that on top of the daily ongoing struggles of so many people and the uncertainty that leaving the EU poses. Just when we hope that spring will help us to turn the corner, at the time of writing we are told that we are now facing a coronavirus pandemic and a grey cloud of uncertainty and fear now hangs over us.

But Easter which we celebrate in April reminds us that we are a PEOPLE of HOPE.

I find myself drawing a parallel between ourselves and the disciples at the time, although very different in circumstance.

They had witnessed Jesus in anguish in the Garden of Gethsemane as he faced capture and death on the cross; they had stood and watched him tortured and die, this man whom they believed would be the answer to all their prayers; and they had locked themselves in a room for fear of being punished because of their association with him, we could say self-isolating themselves from danger as we may have to do from the virus. A grey cloud hung over them too and perhaps as Jesus did on the cross, they felt that God was far away at that particular time.

Yet God had not abandoned them. On Easter morning came that extraordinary moment at the empty tomb when Mary came face to face with the Risen Jesus. This and subsequent appearances changed that group of frightened men and women into intrepid and loyal lifetime followers of Christ. Their misery turned to joy, their doubt to certainty, and their lives transformed.

God's love and hope were confirmed once and for all.

The Risen Christ continues to transform lives as we respond to his free gift of unconditional love and forgiveness and follow him. Acceptance and new life with him however does not bring with it some sort of magical outward cover that protects us from all ills. But Christ does offer us hope, and it is the experience of many over the centuries, and today, that he gives us the courage to face whatever lies ahead as he faithfully walks that walk with us.

We are a PEOPLE of HOPE. May we walk with Christ this Eastertime in whatever circumstances we find ourselves.

Jesus Christ is Risen. Hallelujah!



Events & Activities

The Stavely Historical Society

Our talk on 9th March was by Roger Oldfield - "The Line over the Top" which turned out to be the story of the Settle to Carlisle Railway line, which was constructed over the Blea Moor in the mid-19th century.



Roger enthralled us with his story of how

the line was designed by engineer John Crossley, and laid in 7 years against all the odds: over challenging and dangerous terrain, steep hills, swamps, ravines, streams, floods, snowdrifts and significant fault lines.

We followed his tour of the line from South to North, viewing some fascinating slides of "then" and now, while being told about the unsung heroes, the "navvies', 6,000 of whom toiled on the line, many of whom were lost due to injury, disease, accidents, death, alcoholism and fights. Special attention was given to the 24-arch Ribblehead Viaduct, a masterpiece of engineering and yet a thing of great beauty.

To end a most interesting evening, we particularly enjoyed the views of the attractive Victorian stations, and particularly the statue of Ruswarp the dog at Garsdale Station. (And that's a story for another time!)

Unfortunaley, our next meeting on 6th April has been cancelled due to current health reasons and our speaker will be re-booked for the Autumn season, when the situation should be resolved.

We would like to thank all society members and organisers for a wonderful series of talks this season, despite sad events over the past few months, and look forward to welcoming you all back in the Autumn.




STOP PRESS!.....

The Post Office is planning to start a mobile PO service for Staveley.

They intend to visit on Fridays 11.30 -12.30 and will be stationed in the Village Hall Car Park. They will offer the full range of PO services.

What is Yorkits?

Yorkits is a grassroots ,woman to woman project , making and delivering sustainable menstrual hygiene kits for women in the Global south,to end period poverty.

Where did it begin?

Yorkits was founded by Issy Sanderson from York, adapting an American project called' Days for girls', but with a more personal and sustainable approach. Workshops are held in York and surrounding areas and, Scotton group was started in October 2017 after several learning visits to York.

What is included in a Yorkit?

A Yorkit includes all items for period management, in a brightly coloured, individually sewn drawstring bag, with a plastic Ziplock bag as a waterproof inner. 2 shields are sewn from waterproof fabric and coloured cotton, with pockets to insert the absorbent brushed cotton liners.- 6 in all. The loaded shields are attached with

press studs. These complete pads are washable and re-usable and should last 3 years. 2 pairs of pants are included- not white, in various sizes. (Don't assume women own pants to attach pads to !) A flannel and soap leaves /guest soap are included to aid menstrual hygiene. A pictorial instruction leaflet in enclosed. On the back is a compliment slip with a photo of the workshop women. A mini laundry pouch is sewn from PUL to keep soiled items in, separate from other items in the kit. The total cost to produce is around £4.

Who gets a Yorkit?

Yorkits are taken by women working or volunteering in underdeveloped countries so recipients can receive a kit personally to fit their size and requirements. Often this is part of a wider health education programme. In the case of Scotton , kits are taken once a year to Malawi and distributed, most of them have individual names on. Feedback suggests they are well received and enable women to continue education and work without hindrance or interruption. So far 168 have been taken in 2 years and 60 + are in production for this August. Demand is still there, and last year 2 sewing machines were seed funded with other materials and equipment for 2 startups in Blantyre. Another one hopefully in 2020 if funds allow.

Who makes these Yorkits?

Women who can sew and are willing to use their own machine, though we do have 2 spare! Also women who can hand sew press studs, iron/press, draw templates, cut them and pin, or collate all items in a kit bag. Women who can fundraise to buy materials and equipment to do this. Women who can spare/commit to 2 hours a month in congenial company and are committed to our sisters across the world.

Wildflower Planting - Staveley

The oldest areas of Staveley churchyard will no longer be cut on a regular basis as has happened in the past. This will allow the wild flowers to flower and attract bees and other beneficial insects to the site and give a colourful addition to our churchyard. The area at the far side of the churchyard where burials take place will continue to be cut regularly.

A group of children from Staveley School will be planting more wildflowers at the Church on the morning of Tuesday 28th April, instead of at the Nature Reserve as has happened each year for the last five years.

Ken Barker and Fleur Hattersley will cut the meadow area later in the year to allow the wild flowers to seed






