2015.48 Apologies for Absence – Cllr Houseman

2015.49 Declarations of Interest - none

2015.50 Public Participation – Cllr Topham welcomed members of the public

2015.51 Minutes of the previous meeting:

The Minutes of the meeting held on Wednesday 23rd September 2015 were amended at 2015.36 to include the words "for green spaces". Otherwise the Minutes were approved as correct records and signed by the Chairman

2015.52 Reports from other Councillors

Cllr Windass reported on matters from NYCC

- **Devolution** there is currently discussion on various permutations.
- AWRP to be discussed under item 2015.53
- Trading Standards Department there has been an increase in funding due to electronic crime and the effect on vulnerable people
- **Bus services** it was confirmed that the 56 and 57 bus services will remain at their present level
- Reintroduction of County Councillor's allowance this is a £5000 allowance which can be allocated to community projects with a minimum of £300 and a maximum of £5000. Cllr Windass invited proposals for consideration.
- School Bus Services a resident pointed out that the school bus service for St Aidan's and St John Fisher will be withdrawn from September 2016, creating a problem in getting children to school coupled with a potentially huge increase in traffic on Harrogate's roads. The resident wondered whether there was a possibility of Transdev operating a school bus service. Cllr Windass suggested that the pupils use the 56 and 57 bus service but it was pointed out that these services do not start until after 9am and some services do not go to Harrogate. • Fracking in Ryedale – this has yet to be decided on

Cllr Alton reported on matters from HBC

- Planning Flaxby site still under discussion
- Local plan there is new evidence that 518 new houses are required every year in order for HBC to meet its 5 year housing supply. This means that HBC now have enough planning permissions to meet supply for the next 6 years. However this is based on a rationale that younger people cannot afford a new home and therefore the supply has been reduced accordingly. This rationale may be disputed by developers. The Local Plan is due to be finalised by 2017/18 and so developers still have an advantage.
- Electoral Boundary Commission it has been proposed that there will be elections for all councillors will be held every 4 years from 2018, the number of councillors will be reduced to 40 instead of 54 and the boundary wards are set to change. This is all at proposal stage
- Crescent Gardens sale has fallen through but the premises will be remarketed in the Spring
- Green Waste the collection will cease for Winter at the end of November. From 2017 it is proposed that a £39 charge will be levied if any resident wishes to use this service. A resident queried the whereabouts of a questionnaire in relation to this matter but Cllr Alton did not have any information. A resident pointed out that green waste is composted but Cllr Alton confirmed that this does not cover the cost of the collection of green bin. A show of hands indicated that the vast majority of residents present do not agree with the charge.
- **20mph signs** in response to a query from a resident, Cllr Alton could not confirm whether HBC have been asked to join the campaign for a default 20 mph speed restriction on certain roads

- Cllr Topham reported on the last Community Liaison Committee meeting several of
 the residents who live in close proximity to the development had dominated the meeting
 with issues in relation to their houses and it was hoped that the next meeting would
 cover some wider issues
- Jan Garrill gave a presentation on behalf of Two Ridings Community Foundation. Grant applications are now open and residents are invited to contact her or Leilah Vyner for more information. There is a fund of £840,000 for 5 years and whilst all applications will be considered, the grants are primarily to mitigate landscape and visual effects and to enhance cultural heritage and biodiversity. In the event of oversubscription, priority will be given to the most visually impacted areas. There is an expectation that NYCC will be amenable if any screening is to take place on their land eg. verges. Larger grant applications may receive the help of specialist consultants. There were queries as to whether the grants would cover a new playground or speed restriction signs it was explained that this would be permitted only to the extent that this would enhance the environment/cultural heritage. - Church lighting no further update at present
- Benches at Clare How Close and in the cemetery Cllr Shipman was pleased to report that the benches are due to be installed the following week. It was noted that will be an extra cost for installation and fixing

2015.64 Community Hall, Arkendale

- The Community Hall continues to provide popular events but attendance from the immediate local community is disappointing
- The financial accounts are in good shape
- A Health & Safety inspection has been carried out which was successful except there was a comment in relation to children plating in or around the verge abutting the road. A letter has been sent to the Blue Bell to warn patrons of the danger. No response has been received yet

2015.65 Coneythorpe

- **Broadband update** a resident was able to confirm that there should be further news at the end of the month
- 20 mph signs 95 alive have completed their monitoring but could not find any significant issues it was suggested that they had not placed the monitor in the correct place. Further monitoring cannot take place for another 3 years. Cllr Robertshaw to contact the Police Commissioner to raise further awareness. Cllr Robertshaw to contact Area 6 to see if further

awareness could be raised of the issue including the installation of speed traps. Cllr Topham informed the meeting that he has spoken to Ian Gill regarding the HGVs and that the Ian has agreed to leaflet all drivers of HGVs in connection with his business to adhere to a 20 mph speed restriction. There followed a debate between residents and Cllrs as to how to remedy the speeding problem. Cllr Topham pointed out that all road signage should be approved by NYCC so that the process is legal. It was suggested that the installation of "20's plenty" signs should be pursued together with some form of rumble strip or cobbles at the entrance to Coneythorpe. The signs could be designed by the children. It was discussed whether the cost of these initiatives could be covered by the Two Ridings S.106 grants. Cllr Shipman suggested that a sub committee will be formed comprising Coneythorpe residents and Cllr Robertshaw to investigate these initiatives and apply for grants. Arkendale and Flaxby residents requested that information be shared with these villages too.

2015.66 Arkendale

- Road safety a resident requested the installation of a mirror opposite the car park on Moor Lane. Cllr Robertshaw to investigate but this type of installation has usually been organised by residents in the past
- Children's play area se 2015.53 above in relation to grants
- Clean up of The Marr Cllr Bailey confirmed that he had been in touch with HBC and will also contact Two Ridings to investigate the possibility of a grant
